



Ten Basic Facts About Salvation

1. All accountable people are lost in sin. "All guilty"
 2. "All have sinned"
 3. "Neither is there salvation in any other"
 4. All people will not be saved.
 5. Most people will be lost.
 6. Many will be lost that expect to be saved.
 7. None can be saved after death.
 8. None can be saved after the second coming of Christ.
 9. God desires all to be saved.
 10. God will only save those who love him and obey Him.
- Application: Mark 12:34 "When Jesus saw that he answered wisely, He said to him, 'You art not far from the kingdom of God'"
- Ask: Who was he? and Where was he?

ANALYSIS OF FIRST CORINTHIANS 15:58

"Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye steadfast, unmovable, always bounding in the work of the Lord; forasmuch as ye know that your labour is not in vain in the Lord."

The context of this passage is the concluding statement and admonition of the great resurrection chapter in First Corinth-ians 15. Based upon all of the profound truths concerning the resurrection of the dead, Paul exhorts the brethren at Corinth to be faithful.

"STEADFAST"

This word means seated, settled, or fixed. Faithful Christians stay the course. They are not hot one day and then cold the next. You can count on a faithful Christian. They are consistent in their behavior.

"UNMOVABLE"

This word is found in Colossians 1:23, "be not moved away from the hope of the gospel."

"ALWAYS"

We are Christians every day, not just on Sunday. We need to be faithful even when it is not convenient. We are Christians at all times and under all circumstances.

"ABOUNDING"

The word means to be "abundantly furnished." We are to be "rich" in good works and "ready" unto every good work (Titus 3:1; 2 Timothy 6:18).

"THE WORK OF THE LORD"

The Lord's work should have priority in our lives. His kingdom should come first (Matthew 6:33). Jesus said, "I must work the works of him that sent me, while it is day; the night cometh, when no man can work" (John 9:4).

“YE KNOW”

The Bible is a book of absolutes. There is no guess work in the Scriptures. What we do for the Lord will not be in vain. If we stay faithful, no one can take our reward (John 10:27-28). We know that we know (1 John 2:3).

“IN THE LORD”

All faithful service to God today must be “in Christ.” No one can be faithful to God outside of Jesus. To be IN Christ is to be in His church (Galatians 1:22; 1 Corinthians 12:13; Ephesians 1:22-23).

A FIRE IN MY BONES

Jeremiah 20:9 “Then I said, I will not make mention of him, nor speak any more in his name. But his word was in mine heart as a burning fire shut up in my bones, and I was weary with forbearing, and I could not stay.”

Jeremiah wanted to quit, but he couldn't, because there was a fire in his bones.

Morgan said, “Under the stress and strain of his sufferings, he was tempted to abandon the work, to refuse to speak any more in the name of Jehovah. But when he attempted thus to find release from suffering in silence, it was impossible; for such silence became more intolerable than suffering.”

What does fire do for us?

Fire consumes—burns out the sinful and unnecessary stuff in our lives. Wickedness burns like a fire (Isaiah 9:18 “For wickedness burneth as the fire: it shall devour the briers and thorns, and shall kindle in the thickets of the forest, and they shall mount up like the lifting up of smoke.”), but fire also purges the evil (Zechariah 13:9 “And I will bring the third part through the fire, and will refine them as silver is refined, and will try them as gold is tried: they shall call on my name, and I will hear them: I will say, It is my people: and they shall say, The LORD is my God”).

Fire purifies—makes us clean and holy before God (1 Peter 1:7 “That the trial of your faith, being much more precious than of gold that perisheth, though it be tried with fire, might be found unto praise and honour and glory at the appearing of Jesus Christ:”).

Fire prepares (as in food)—makes us tasteful and pleasant to each other.

Fire cheers—when caught in the grip of despair and discouragement, the fire of God cheers us on to victory.

Fire unites—(as in uniting different kinds of metals) brings unity to the people of God.
