Congregational Business Meeting and Fellowship Dinner January 26, 2014

Following worship, Sunday the 26th, we will have a fellowship dinner followed by a congregational meeting. Our fellowships are always the best and always enjoyable. Eating together was a regular practice of the Christians of the first century and

authorized by God for Christians today. While the Jews were subject to various food laws, forbidding to eat several types of food (e.g. pork), the Christian is under no such restriction today. Note the following texts: Matthew 15:17-20 ; Mark 7:15-19; 1 Timothy 4:1-5 "Now the Spirit speaketh expressly, that in the latter times some shall depart from the faith, giving heed to seducing spirits, and doctrines of devils...and commanding to abstain from meats, which God hath created to be received with thanksgiving..." Some will ask: “Where’s your authority to eat in the building?” We ask: “Where’s your authority for the building?” The Bible authorizes generally as well as specifically. 2 Pet 2:13 “...while they feast with you...” “Jude 12 “These are spots in your feasts of charity, when they feast with you, feeding themselves without fear: clouds they are without water, carried about of winds; trees whose fruit withereth, without fruit, twice dead, plucked up by the roots;” Our fellowship dinner on the 26th is authorized and we invite all to stay.

However, The business meeting is only for members of the congregation and we ask that all members participate. We will be looking at our plans for 2014, the next five years and next ten years as we plan our work for the Lord Jesus Christ.

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
