TEACHING?

Parents, listen up: * The average American family has the TV on 49 hours a week, with each family member viewing from 25 to 30 hours per week. * By age 65 an individual has watched 3,000 24 hour days of TV; that's 9 full years. * Each evening between 3 p.m. and 11 p.m. a child can view 113 shootings, 92 stabbings, 168 beatings, 9 stranglings, and 179 more violent acts. * By high school graduation a child will have seen some 18,000 TV murders. * Television portrays a violent act every 16.9 minutes; a killing every 93.8 minutes.

Long ago God told His people, "These words, which I command thee this day, shall be in thine heart: and thou shalt teach them diligently unto thy children, and shalt talk of them when thou sittest in thine house, and when thou walkest by the way, and when thou liest down, and when thou risest up" (Deuteronomy 6:6-7).
