Our worship services include congregational singing of psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs (Ephesians 5:19).

Several prayers are offered to God as well (Acts 2:42).

Communion is observed by partaking of unleavened bread and fruit of the vine (1 Corinthians 11:23-29).

Members make a financial offering for the poor and the spread of the gospel (1 Corinthians 16:1-2).
Guests are not expected to give.

Then our preacher delivers a sermon from the Bible. All are encouraged to bring their Bibles and follow along (2 Timothy 2:15).

We will offer the Lord's invitation (Matthew 11:28-30) for any who want to become Christians, repent or make special requests for their lives to God.

The service lasts about an hour. Guests may sit silently in the service, or they may participate.

Let all things be done decently and in order.
(1 Corinthians 14:40)

WHAT YOU MAY FIND TO BE DIFFERENT

You must repent of your sins. (Acts 3:19) But repentance alone is not enough. Saul, for example, prayed following his meeting with Jesus on the road to Damascus (Acts 9:11), but Saul was still in his sins when Ananias met him three days later (Acts 22:16). Cornelius prayed to God always, and yet there was something else he needed to do to be saved (Acts 10:2, 6, 33, 48).

You must, with sincere heart-belief, confess that Jesus is Lord. He is Lord whether you confess it or not, but it is unto your salvation that you must acknowledge His deity and His ownership (Romans 10:9-10).

Having believed, repented, and confessed that Jesus is the Son of God, you must be baptized for the remission of your sins. (Acts 2:38) It is at this point (and not before) that your sins are forgiven. (Acts 22:16) (Acts 8:35-36; Romans 6:3-4; 1 Peter 3:21)

Once you are saved, God adds you to His church and writes your name in the Book of Life. (Acts 2:47; Philippians 4:3) To continue in God's grace, you must continue to serve God faithfully until death. Unless they remain faithful, those who are in God's grace will fall from grace, and those whose names are in the Book of Life will have their names blotted out of that book. (Revelation 2:10; Revelation 3:5; Galatians 5:4)

Matthew 6:33: But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you.

LORD'S SUPPER OBSERVED EACH SUNDAY

The church of Christ has communion every week, just as they did in New Testament times (Acts 20:7). It is a highlight of the week to commemorate Christ's death and celebrate his promised return.

A CAPELLA SINGING

The whole congregation sings a capella (without mechanical instruments), just as they did in New Testament times (Ephesians 5:19; Colossians 3:16). Visitors may sing along or simply listen. Some say they find it easier to focus on the song's meaning since the words are more easily understood than with musical accompaniment.

EMPHASIS ON FAMILY AND BIBLE

The church of Christ places a great emphasis on Bible school. We feel that children are important and that our God-given responsibility is to assist parents in teaching them about their origin, purpose, and destiny. They should come to know their Creator, Redeemer, Lord, and Savior early in life (Ecclesiastes 12:1; Matthew 19:14). They have been born into a mixed-up world, so we try to ground them in the simple truth so they will know right from wrong. So bring your Bible and come for that visit you've been thinking about. GOD'S PLAN OF SALVATION

Hear /Believe /Repent /Confess /Be Baptized /Live Faithfully

You must believe and have faith in God because "without faith it is impossible to please Him:

for He that cometh to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of them that diligently seek Him." (Hebrews 11:6)

But neither belief alone nor faith alone is sufficient to save. (James 2:19; James 2:24; Matthew 7:21).

You must hear the gospel and then understand and recognize that you are lost without Jesus Christ no matter who you are and no matter what your background is. The Bible tells us that "all have sinned, and come short and in need to seek Him. Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me." (John 14:6)

You must believe and have faith in God because "without faith it is impossible to please Him: for He that cometh to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of them that diligently seek Him." (Hebrews 11:6)
